Although it bears some resemblance to the Qingming Festival (Tomb-sweeping Day), both festivals are different in their natures. Qingming Festival is the day when the Chinese pay homage to their deceased ancestors by sweeping their tombs and preparing food offerings and burning paper money for them. While on the Ghost Festival, although the food offerings are prepared and paper money is burnt, yet they are not only for their deceased ancestors, but also for the so-called unknown lost souls who have no one to pay tribute to,.

The most popular story about the origin of this festival is about a monk whose name is Mulian. When Mulian became the chief disciple of the Buddha, he began to miss his mother very much and he used his clairvoyant power to check what had happened to her. To his sorrow, he found out that his mother had been suffering in hell because she treated people badly while she was alive. She was being punished by being unable to digest anything that had passed through her throat. As she had such a big belly, she was thus always feeling hungry. Mulian begged the Buddha to free his mother from such torture, who in turn instructed him to prepare lots of food offerings and have lots of monks recite scriptures to help him liberate his mother. And there go the traditional rituals of the Ghost Festival.
