What do Taipei 101 and the Empire State Building, a New York City landmark, have in common? If you said, "Both are tall buildings," you are definitely on the right track. A better, more precise answer is that both were once the tallest buildings in the world and they each hold an annual running event up a vertical course, which is the latest trend in running. Those who take part annually in the Taipei 101 running event must

conquer 2,046 steps from the ground floor to the 91st. It's an intimidating feat, but it regularly attracts about 2,000 people. Climbing the Empire State Building's 1,576 steps, which run a distance of 320 meters nearly straight upwards, is also a difficult task. After all, the Empire State Building was the world's tallest skyscraper for 42 years, a record that is unlikely to be matched, much less surpassed, in the future. The record for the run up the building's stairs is just nine minutes and 33 seconds. In addition to the Empire State Building and Taipei 101, vertical runs take place in other famous buildings and structures around the planet. These include the CN Tower in Toronto, Canada, and the Willis Tower in the American city of Chicago.

To take part in this type of challenge, runners definitely need to be fleet of foot. While these events are races, and the first one to the highest **accessible** point of the structures is the winner, vertical courses are more a test of stamina than speed. It's not easy negotiating stairways and climbing up distances most people would only dream of traveling in an elevator!

In 1885, Mark Twain's novel *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* was first published. It tells the story of a rebellious teenager who travels down the Mississippi river on a raft with a runaway slave called Jim. The book turned Twain into a household name and is now regarded as a typical American work of art. The great American novelist Ernest Hemingway remarked: "All modern American literature comes from one book by Mark Twain called *Huckleberry Finn*."

What made *Huckleberry Finn* unique among other American novels? One important factor is Twain's employment of American slang and idiom. Few American authors before Twain had used distinctly American speech in their writing. Most of them imitated the elegant dialogue of English authors, for it was thought great literature should not contain the coarse or vulgar language of common people. However, Twain wanted readers to be able to identify with his characters and their manners of speaking. *Huckleberry*, the story's narrator, is uneducated and speaks ungrammatical English. When, for instance, he relates a tale of a woman teaching him about the Bible, he says: "she learned me," instead of "she taught me." He also uses slang words like "ain't" in place of "am not," "isn't," and "aren't" a lot. Jim's African-American dialect is also full of slang. Students today can sometimes find Jim's dialogue difficult to grasp.

Another thing that gives the novel a specifically American flavor is the theme of freedom. Jim wants to escape from his life as a slave and Huck tries to help him. At first, Huck is not sure whether he is doing the right thing but when Jim becomes his friend, he is certain about it. It is clear that Twain meant to expose racist attitudes and the injustice of slavery. The novel also deals with another kind of freedom, which is the freedom to roam. Huck is free from society's rules as he floats along the Mississippi, with no particular destination in mind. America was a country built on the notion of a constantly expanding frontier, which allowed people to move freely. This idea of freedom, as an open road, was to influence later American literary works.

American readers readily identified with both the language and themes in *Huckleberry Finn*. The speech of

Twain's characters was a realistic representation of the slang of the American South. Also, slavery and freedom of movement were both relevant to Americans at the time and had a strong influence on Twentieth Century American literature. For these reasons, Hemingway and others praised the book, calling it the first truly American novel, a status that is surely deserved.
