transforms her from a spoiled, whiny child __42__ a responsible, capable girl, and the whole process is similar to the __43__ that occurred in Miyazaki's life.

When Miyazaki was about six, his mother contracted tuberculosis. Her treatment continued during his teenage years, and this meant that Miyazaki had to care for his two younger brothers. __44__, Miyazaki drew pictures and made up stories to entertain them. Gradually, he developed keen drawing skills, a fertile imagination, and the ability to convey stories through images. __45__ his unusual childhood circumstances, Miyazaki might never have gone on creating so many entrancing animated films.

Another early influence on Miyazaki was the work of his father and uncle in the aviation industry. As he was a child, Miyazaki spent hours drawing planes. This led to his lifelong interest in flying. After he started to create his own works, flying naturally became a repeated theme. Miyazaki's various flying vehicles include a witch's broom, massive military vessels, _46__ -often with emphasis on designs that were never, or could never be, possible in real life. Without his early exposure 47 aviation, Miyazaki would not have been so inspired by flying.

Miyazaki's films stand out also because his characters reflect reality. The characters of Miyazaki's films, unlike __48__ of most typical Hollywood animated films, are neither completely righteous nor completely wicked, which is very true to life and makes his films one of a kind. As a story unfolds, villains reveal certain positive traits, 49 their violence, evil, and hatred. Good and bad fuse together, and the tension between them gives richness and complexity to Miyazaki's stories. These stories illustrate that there are always positive things __50__ living for: joy to be found, a peaceful resolution to be attempted, and love to be embraced.

Hatred between different groups of people is often the reason behind the most terrifying massacres in human history. Just
imagine one out of ten people in your country being killed by neighbors in three months. Tragically, this nightmare became a
reality in Rwanda51 The Tutsis ruled Rwanda for many years until the Hutus overthrew them in the 1950s.
52 In 1990 the RPF invaded Rwanda and started a civil war lasting for three years. On April 6, 1994, an airplane
carrying the Hutu president was shot down, killing all on board53 From April 7 to mid-July, 1994, during a period of
approximately 100 days, about 80 percent of the Tutsis were brutally killed.
For the victims of the Rwandan Genocide, international intervention came too late. The Rwandan people were shot, stabbed,
blown up, burned alive, drowned or beaten to death while the international community did little to stop any of these brutal acts.
Soon, the United Nations withdrew as well. At the end of April, the U.N. spoke against the killing but refused to
step in. Rwanda was left to suffer on their own. Not even young children or old people were spared55 After almost a
million people were dead, on June 22, French troops arrived. Then in July, a new Rwandan government was established, which
officially marked the end of one of the darkest chapters in human history.

- · Argentina is the eighth largest country in the world and the second largest in South America.
- The country was once home to some of the world's largest dinosaurs! Over the past 10 years, the bones of multiple giant dinosaurs have been discovered. One enormous creature, "Giganotosaurus" was thought to be 13.2 meters long and weigh nearly 15 tons!
- South America's hottest and coldest weather has been recorded in Argentina. Temperatures can range from 49.1 degrees Celsius to minus 32.8 degrees Celsius.

(C) People have long had myths about animals. Take, for instance, the idea that camels' humps contain water. In fact, these humps are large, energy-storing fat deposits, weighing up to 36 kilograms. While this fat can produce water, it cannot hydrate the animal. The camel's low body temperature allows water to be retained by the camel for seven days without a drink.

Another myth is that leaving our smell on a baby bird by touching it causes its mother to abandon it. The fact that birds hardly use their sense of smell puts this false idea to rest. Adult birds protect their young no matter what creatures come into contact with them.

Unlike the mice in many children's stories and movies, real mice aren't partial to cheese. Studies show that they prefer foods high in sugar, such as fruit and grain, while cheese disgusts their sensitive noses. Makers of Britain's best-selling mousetrap say peanut butter and chocolate make much better bait.

While it's true that dogs are colorblind, it does not mean that they see everything in black and white. Like colorblind people, dogs are missing one kind of cone in their eyes, which limits their visible range of color. The shades of blue, yellow and gray that they do see can be very helpful as many are farsighted.

Our concept that one human year is equal to seven dog years has been fought about for some time. Many canine experts say that overall dogs age 10.5 years per human year their first two years. After that, dogs age four dog years per human year.

As we become better acquainted with our world, we can put all these myths to rest.
