All pop artists like to say that they 46 their success to their fans. In the case of British band SVM, it's indeed true. The band is currently recording songs because 358 fans contributed the £100,000 needed for the project. The arrangement came via MMC, an online record label that uses Web-based, social-network-style "crowd-funding" to 47 its acts.

Here's how it works: MMC posts demos and videos of 10 artists on its website, and users are invited to invest from £10 to £1,000 in the ones they most enjoy or think are most likely to become popular. Once an act reaches £100,000, the money-raising process is completed, and the money is used to pay for recording and possibly a concert tour. Profits from resulting music sales, concerts, and 48 are split three ways: investors get to divide 40%; another 40% goes to MMC; the artist pockets 20%. The 49 for investors can be big. One fan in France who contributed £4,250 got his money back 50 over.

Huashan 1914 Creative Park and the Red House are excellent 51 for promoting the creative arts in Taipei. Pinkoi is another avenue for Taiwanese designers and artists to sell their products, this one a 52 method rather than an actual physical location. The e-commerce site was 53 in October 2010. Just three years after that, it featured nearly 50000 listings, more than 2000 brands and 7000 designers. The site continues to expand with its two main channels of 54 : allowing designers to sell directly to buyers with Pinkoi taking a commission, and 55 as an electronic marketplace with larger design brands selling their products and a percentage of the selling price.

Indeed, many people only get a partial look at people's lives on the Internet. This can make some feel isolated because they tend to compare their own lives with those of others, which might seemingly look perfect on the screen of a computer or mobile phone.

It was the article that filled the Internet with comments, links, and blog posts. "Why Chinese Mothers Are Superior?" - this short article in both the print and online versions of the *Wall Street Journal* certainly caused quite a controversy. Even the article's title rubbed some people the wrong way, and many even doubted the points in the article.

Written by Amy Chua, a second-generation Chinese-American and law professor at Yale University, the article attempted to explain how Chinese mothers in America are able to raise so many stereotypically successful children. She began by listing all of the things that most American kids do, but that her two daughters were never allowed to do, when growing up: no sleepovers, no play dates, no TV, no computer games, and no grade below an A. In addition, the two had to learn a musical instrument, and it had to be the piano or the violin.

Chua's parents were of Chinese descent, and they immigrated to the United States from the Philippines. Raised in a strict fashion in the United States, Chua excelled academically and ended up with degrees from Ivy League schools. When Chua became a parent, she was determined that her children, third-generation Chinese, would not be raised like most other American kids. She wanted to raise them, in her words, as a "Chinese mother" — strict, demanding, and unyielding.

Reactions to the article, and Chua's parenting techniques, have been varied. Some say that some of her actions, including calling one daughter "garbage" and not allowing another to eat dinner or go to the bathroom until a piano piece had been learned, can be regarded as abuse. Others point out that the article was published a few days before the release of Chua's book, *Battle Hymn of the Tiger Mother*, and was deliberately controversial in order to boost sales.

One thing is certain: the article has certainly raised questions in America — and around the world — about which style of parenting is best. Is a more permissive Western style better? Or is a more demanding Eastern style ideal? Or could it be a combination of the two?

There is a campaign that has been gaining popularity in Europe called "Sharing a Refrigerator" designed to reduce the volume of wasted food. People in an office or a dormitory share the contents of the same refrigerator, whether they are a bottle of milk, a package of franks, or other food items. In order for the program to work, certain rules must be followed. These include labeling when the food was made or bought, giving each person enough space to put food inside, **replenishing** the contents of the fridge when necessary, and keeping the food in leak-proof containers. It's interesting to see how the amount of food that is thrown away dwindles and how much less selfish and more cooperative people become when participating in the "Sharing a Refrigerator" campaign. One place where the sharing program has been tried on a wider scale is in Spain's Basque province under the name "Solidarity Fridge." There, public refrigerators offer food and welcome donations on city streets. The two campaign appear to wake up people's dormant virtues of compassion and generosity.

Programs such as "Solidarity Fridge" and "Sharing a Refrigerator" offer a way to help reduce food waste in a world where millions of people, especially in Asia and Africa, are on the brink of death from hunger. Meanwhile, in the US alone, a startling US\$165 billion worth of food is thrown away each year. That is because the average American family throws out more than 1,000 pounds of food each year. With regard to Western countries as a whole, about 40 percent of all food ends up in the trash.
