Have you ever been on your way somewhere in a big hurry, only to be delayed by a traffic accident or road construction? Imagine being notified of those problems as you are on the road. Smart traffic cameras could be set up to communicate with one another to create an efficient citywide transportation system or an even larger framework. Through such a system, drivers could receive instructions sent to traffic signs about the best routes to take. All of this and more are possible because of the Internet of Things (IoT). The term IoT was coined in 1999 by British businessman Kevin Ashton. However, the concept of connected devices has been talked about at least since the 1970s, long before the development of the Net made the Internet of Things a definite possibility.

With the advances in computer communication such as cloud computing and other networks, the IoT has a lot of potential to provide a complete transformation of how we live our lives. In many ways, that transformation has already begun as many IoT applications now exist to help us in our everyday lives. An example of this is wearable tech such as FitBit that keeps track of our fitness and sleep. For home automation, there is Nest. It is certain, though, that simple sensors embedded in physical things can become far grander. To some, the IoT may seem like something from some far-off future, but it is estimated that about 26 billion devices will be connected by 2020.

A Taiwanese business, Lung Meng Technology Company, has spent more than US\$50 million and 17 years developing a special type of paper made from stone. By perfecting the process of turning discarded waste from the marble industry into paper, they have come up with a product that is smooth, nonflammable, and water resistant.
