dietary supplements, but things are not improving. Well, you might have overlooked something that is, incidentally, within easy reach – water. Fatigue and unhealthy skin are two common but easily \_\_66\_\_ symptoms of dehydration. "But I don't sweat that much and anyway I don't feel thirsty," you might protest. In fact, sweating is just one of the \_\_67\_\_ through which we lose water. Many of our bodily functions run on water, too. One such example is digestion. What's more, water makes people feel full and helps reduce their desire to eat large \_\_68\_\_. So this is very good news to those trying to shed a few pounds. Another little known benefit of regular and sufficient water consumption is that it \_\_69\_\_ pain. Also, since some of the body's toxins can lead to acne or other skin problems, drinking enough water helps \_\_70\_\_ the toxins, bringing a smile to your face every time you look in the mirror. Nothing bothers us more than the buzzing noise from a flying mosquito when we are sleeping. And more often than not, we will end up with itchy red welts on our bodies. So, what can we do to keep these irritating insects \_\_71\_\_? Research has shown that mosquitoes bite some people more than others. These include \_\_72\_\_ are pregnant, have a higher-than-normal body temperature or have type O blood. If you are a mosquito magnet, stay inside \_\_73\_\_ possible, especially at dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are more likely to bite. It is also advised to wear light, bright colors as dark colors attract the insects. Another useful thing to do is rubbing mosquito \_\_74\_\_ on exposed skin. The most effective ones are those containing DEET. But since DEET products may cause health and environmental problems, some people prefer plant oils, like lemon eucalyptus and citronella. Mosquito coils also keep mosquitoes away. \_\_75\_\_, the smoke from them pollutes and can damage the lungs, so they should be used with care. With the climate getting warmer, make sure you try the above methods to avoid mosquito bites.

## V. Reading Comprehension (10%, @2)

As spring hits and the weather gets warmer, many students in the United States enjoy competing in track and field events across the country. Commonly referred to as "track" in the U.S., track and field is also known as "athletics" in other areas of the world. Unlike other sports, track includes a wide range of different types of competitions: from running to jumping to throwing.

All events take place outside. Runners compete in events on an oval track, while competitions in jumping and throwing take place in the center field. Running events include everything from very short distance **sprints** all the way to the 10,000 meter event. Many runners compete in multiple events while some athletes specialize in just a single event.

Great athletes in track often serve as an inspiration to others. Fanny Blankers-Koen for example, set a world record in the 80m hurdles a year after giving birth to her first child. Then, despite being told she was too old, she won four gold medals at the 1948 Olympics!

Usain Bolt is another inspiring example of not giving up on one's dreams. In the 2004 Olympics, Usain had an injury that prevented him from competing well. Then, he suffered more injuries in 2005 and 2006. However, he returned in the 2008 Olympics to not only win three gold medals, but also set new Olympic and world records!

We walk over them, drive over them, and sometimes even dread them. Bridges are examples of great design and beauty that often don't receive much attention. However, they should be seen, studied and experienced with appreciation. A quick look at the world's greatest bridges will give anyone a desire to travel.

A well-known example found in San Francisco, California is a great place to start. It's possible that more people know this bridge by sight than anything else. Of course, the city's red-orange Golden Gate Bridge is basically a movie star. And while it's no longer the world's longest suspension bridge, it's still the prettiest.

Moving to Europe, there are many historical bridges that have existed for many years. The Ponte Vecchio in Florence, Italy makes this clear with a name meaning "Old Bridge." It dates back to the Romans but was last rebuilt in 1345. It is also the only bridge in Florence that didn't fall during World War II.

Many bridges are wonderful to look at, but some are amazing to use. Japan's Akashi Strait Bridge is the world's longest suspension bridge at nearly 2,000 meters. Plans for the bridge were made when two ferries sank and killed 168 in 1955. Now the bridge makes travel much safer for many Japanese locals.

Finally, some bridges are reminders of the relationships they create. The Suez Canal Bridge starts in Egypt and ends at the Sinai Peninsula. This creates a nearly 4-kilometer road between Africa and Eurasia! The Japanese helped Egypt pay for and build the bridge as well. This makes it a great example of a bridge's purpose – to bring people together.
