In the mid-1970s Australian professor Bill Mollison and his graduate student David Holmgren were working on systems to restore **impoverished soils** in Tasmania. They called their approach "permaculture," a way to design methods to support permanent agriculture.

Today permaculture is a design principle not just for gardening and agriculture but also architecture, community design and even money management! It can be expressed in 12 principles that help place different elements together to support and sustain one another. It draws on scientific observation and research, as well as traditional wisdom and practices. Permaculture design has reached well beyond its beginnings in Tasmania, and has become a way of life for many people.

After Bill Mollison published his second book on permaculture, one reviewer described it as revolutionary. Mollison agreed because permaculture means working towards greater food independence. You do not need to be a farmer to practice permaculture. Small spaces on rooftops or in urban landscapes can be used to grow food. A central principle of permaculture is to understand how plants grow in nature. Plants that need a lot of water should be planted downhill from ones that need less. Instead of growing just one plant in an area, you should grow certain plants together to make them healthier. But many of the design principles can actually be applied to everyday life. They stress observation, reusable resources, variety and integration rather than separation.

An old saying goes: "Give a man a fish, and you feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish, and you feed him for a lifetime." That wisdom led one group help those suffering from hunger in a different way.

The charity organization Heifer International wants to feed people for a lifetime. In the 1930s, an American farmer went to Spain to help people in need. That farmer, Dan West, saw how difficult it was to try to feed people with imported powdered milk.

On Heifer International's web page today, you will see a catalog of animals you can buy to help hungry people. Not just cows, goats, chickens and pigs are for sale, however. You can also give fish, water buffalo or even honeybees! Buying livestock supports programs that help at least 1000 families. Each gift fits into a system that is designed to make a permanent change to an area affected by hunger.

The programs help small-scale farmers, and there are certain requirements. People who receive a gift must also pass it on. Heifer provides animals that are ready to have babies as well as training regarding maintaining the animals' health and feeding them. All the farmers involved must also agree to help teach others.

But Heifer International's work doesn't end there. They want to support a positive cycle of change. That means working with communities until they don't need outside help. If everyone works together, poverty and hunger won't have to **take a toll** on humanity.

Nobody enjoys feeling guilty, but this emotion has a purpose: letting people know they did something wrong. But because it feels so bad, it can also destroy relationships or people if it isn't handled well. Some people avoid others out of guilt for past actions, while others try to numb the pain of guilt with bad habits.

The first question involved in dealing with guilt is: Is it true? If feelings of guilt are pointing to something you actually did wrong, then don't try to hide. Admit what you did, apologize to anyone affected, and do what you can to make things right.

But sometimes people feel guilty for things that aren't wrong. Perhaps they have too high expectations for themselves and feel bad whenever they make mistakes. I once felt very guilty for breaking up with a young man I was dating. I needed to remind myself that I had good reasons for breaking up. In the long run, he would be better off finding a girl who was a better fit for him than I was. I felt bad for hurting him, but I had not actually done anything wrong.

Like true guilt, false guilt needs to be acknowledged and faced. If you experience false guilt, try to balance it out with positive thoughts, and remind yourself that you did nothing wrong. It may take time, but it's possible for your feelings to change.
