A study done by researchers at the University of Utah has provided further proof that the level of distraction experienced by drivers using cell phones is similar to that experienced by drunk drivers. Perhaps surprisingly, the study also found that even drivers using hands-free cell phones were as distracting as those using handheld cell phones.

Professor David Strayer and his fellow researchers did their study with forty volunteers under four different conditions, which included driving without distractions, driving while using a handheld phone, driving while using a hands-free phone, and driving while drunk. The results of the study indicated that the probability of failing to stop at a crossing or being involved in a rear-end collision is greater for drivers using their cell phones in either way than it is for drivers with no such distractions. Even the probability of a driver failing to see an object clearly in their view was higher than that of those without using mobile devices. Professor Strayer described the distraction caused by talking on a cell phone as a form of blindness which decreased drivers' awareness of important information in the driving scene.

Roger Vincent, an expert in prevention of accidents, elaborated on the behavior shown by cell phone users while driving: "You get sucked more and more into the conversation, and you pay less and less attention to the road." He suggested a ban on all kinds of uses of cell phones while driving and tougher penalties on drivers could be beneficial. "Previous studies have shown that you are four times more likely to crash if you are using a handheld or a hands-free phone," stated Vincent.

The use of hands-free cell phones is currently legal in the UK; however, drivers can be prosecuted if it is proven that they do not have proper control over their vehicle. Hopefully, Strayer's study and the previous research can help lead to bans on driving while using the cell phone in either way.

2. A microchip is a unit of computer circuitry. It is built into a small piece of a material called silicon, which can be used to control things, computers and machines in particular. Microchips help not only blind people to see, but other disabled people to carry out everyday tasks more easily.

For example, a cochlear implant (人工耳蝸) with a microchip enables deaf people to hear. It is implanted in the skin or bone behind the ear. The microchip would change sound to electricity and send the electrical information to the brain. It allows deaf people some hearing, though the sound is not perfect.

In a similar way, microchips could also help blind people to see by changing light into electrical signals. Microchips could also be implanted into muscles, making people who cannot speak to control a computer that could speak for them. For those disabled people whose limbs do not work, the computer control also serves as their artificial arms or legs, helping them to turn lights on or move wheelchairs.

By helping people to see, hear, move and communicate, microchip implants could help disabled people to live on their own, and even go out to work. Technological progress in microchips could bring many benefits, not only to those with disabilities, but to all

human beings in the future. We are lucky to live in the world of modern technology.
