Everyone knows washing hands stops the spread of disease. In the past, however, this idea was ignored. In 1846, when Ignaz Semmelweis began working in a hospital, childbirth was dangerous for women. After giving birth, many women developed a serious infection called childbed fever. Nobody knew what caused the fearful infection. In Semmelweis's hospital, the women who were helped by doctors during childbirth had a higher chance of developing this infection than the women who were helped by midwives. Semmelweis wondered why this was, so he decided to look into it. He found that the doctors often carried out autopsies before helping with childbirth. He suspected that infection was being spread from dead bodies through touch. Semmelweis then ordered the other hospital workers to wash their hands after autopsies. Thanks to his action, the rate of childbed fever soon dropped throughout the hospital.




People who only have seen seals in animal theme parks might think of them as cute, playful creatures that love to balance beach balls on their noses. But they are much more interesting than that. Seals are in fact hunting machines that can race through the water at a high speed. They can dive down to a depth of 900 meters and hold their breath for up to two hours. These abilities allow them to easily catch their prey, mostly fish and crabs. Most of a seal's body weight is made up of fat, which keeps them warm in freezing waters, where they normally live. Therefore, they need to eat a lot of food, typically around five percent of their body weight per day. The largest type of seals can weigh up to 4,000 kilograms, and that means they can eat over 200 kilograms of food a day!


