Many successful CEOs wake up early. Tim Cook, Indra Nooyi, and Bob Iger all begin their days before 5am. The early bird gets the worm! Early to bed, early to rise! Right? Not necessarily. Although night owls don't have a reputation for productivity, it turns out this has nothing to do with the time of day they wake up, but rather how much they understand themselves. Adam Grant explains. "The world's most successful people aren't worried about what time others wake up. They wake and work on the schedule that works for them."

But if you find that you get more done when most people are already in bed, then go with that. Forcing yourself into another person's schedule isn't a good idea. The time of day you complete tasks isn't important. After all, success is all about what you accomplish, not when you accomplish it.

Essential oils play an important role in the production of perfume. The most common way of collecting essential oils is steam distillation. It uses heated steam to extract essential oils from the plant materials. The process begins with heating water to produce steam. As the steam goes up and passes through the raw plant materials, the heat makes them release essential oils. Then the steam carrying the essential oils keeps going into the cooling tube. There the steam cools and turns back into liquid form. The liquid then drips down from the tube into a container beneath. Since essential oils don't dissolve in water and are lighter than water, the liquid will narratively separate into two years. The essential oils float to the top, and the water stays on the bottom.
